PROGRAMMES

BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A.)

NSoJ is affiliated to Bengaluru Central University and offers a three year Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree programme. In 2018-19, 75% of our students who appeared for university exams obtained a first class with 58% securing a distinction.

In addition to the academic curriculum prescribed by Bengaluru Central University, our B.A. students are required to complete various professional skill based courses, including in writing, photography, film-making, public speaking, social media, public relations, TV anchoring and advertising. We invite applications for our B.A. degree programmes from talented candidates who have completed Std. XII (or equivalent) with good academic credentials, strong extra-curricular achievements and demonstrated commitment to truth and justice.

PG DIPLOMA IN JOURNALISM (P.G.D.J.)

NSoJ offers a one-year PG Diploma in Journalism programme with specialisations in Broadcast and Print & Convergence media. Our P.G.D.J. students are trained to become ethical and responsible journalists who passionately work to convey truth and humanity through news stories.

We combine academic rigour with professional skill based courses using the acclaimed NSoJ Method that has been used to train world-class journalists, who work in news organisations such as The Hindu, The Caravan, CNBC, The News Minute, Deccan Chronicle, Outlook and Republic TV. We receive applications for our P.G.D.J. programmes from candidates with diverse academic backgrounds, including in arts, humanities, commerce, engineering and medicine.



TALKS, PANEL DISCUSSIONS AND DEBATES

Our students are provided with opportunities to interact closely with leading international, national and local public figures who regularly visit NSoJ for talks and workshops. NSoJ regularly hosts panel discussions and debates featuring public figures on current issues. NSoJ's annual journalism festival, Slant, has grown over the years to become the top journalism festival in the country.
